The Conjoint Bachelor of Engineering with Honours and Bachelor of Health Science (BE(Hons)/BHSc – 675 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2024.
- (b) This degree was first o ered in 2024.

2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, P hanga | Executive Dean of Engineering or delegate, in consultation with the Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate, may approve a variation of these regulations.

3. The structure of the qualification

To qualify for the Conjoint Bachelor of BE(Hons) and Health Science, a student must:

- (a) be credited with a minimum of 675 points towards the qualification,
- (b) be credited with a minimum of 405 points from courses in the Bachelor of Engineering with Honours regulations; including:

7. Transfers of credit, substitutions and cross-credits

This qualification adheres to the Credit Recognition and Transfer Regulations with the following additional stipulations:

- (a) A maximum of 60 points may be credited to a conjoint combination from a previously completed degree.
- (b) In all circumstances, a conjoint degree's combination must include at least 300 points in BE(Hons) above 100-level and 180 points in the non-engineering degree completed at the Te Whare W nanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury.

8. Progression

This qualification adheres to the General Regulations with the following additional stipulations:

(a) A student unable to maintain an overall GPA of 6.0 will be restricted to 120 points per year and students must maintain a GPA of 5.0 to remain in the qualification.
