# The Degree of Master of Social Work (MSW – 120 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

### 1.Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2025.
- (b) This degree was rst o ered in 2002.

### 2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate ma approve a personal programme of study which does not conform to these Regulations.

## 3. The structure of the quali cation

The degree must consist of the submission of a thesis SOWK 695.

# 4. Admission to the quali cation

To be admitted to the Master of Social Work a student must have:

## (a) either

- i. quali ed for a Bachelor of Social Work degree with First Class Honours, or Second Class Honours Division I, in Aotearoa New Zealand; or
- ii. quali ed for a bachelor's degree and the Graduate Diploma in Social Work (if conferred before 2009) or Postgraduate Diploma in Social Work with B+ Grade Point Average or above; or
- iii. quali ed for a bachelor's degree and completed a qualifying course prescribed by the Head of Social Work, and approved by the Amo Matua, Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate a standard equivalent to the prerequisite courses; or
- iv. been admitted under the Regulations for admission with Academic Equivalent Standing as entitled to enrol for the Degree of Master of Social Work; and
- (b) obtained a professional quali cation in Social Work approved by the Kaihaut Tauwhiro Hapori | Programme Director, Social Work, and
- (c) been approved as a student for the degree by the Amo Matua, Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate.
- (d) Notwithstanding the above, in special cases the Amo Matua, Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate may determine the conditions under which a student who does not meet Regulation 4(a) shall be admitted to the quali cation.

## 5. Subjects

The subject for this degree is Social Work.

### Time limits

The time limit for the Master of Social Work is:

- (a) 12 months for a full-time student, or
- (b) 36 months for a part-time student.
