

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2025.
- (b) This Diploma was first o ered in 2025.

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Ture | Executive Dean of Law or delegate may approve a personal course of study which does not conform to these Regulations.

To qualify for the Graduate Diploma in Laws a student must:

- (a) be credited with a minimum of 120 points from Schedule E: Elective Courses at 300-level for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws: and
- (b) have their programme of study approved by the Amo Matua, Ture | Executive Dean of Law of delegate.

To be admitted to the Graduate Diploma in Laws, a student must:

- (a) have
 - qualified for a Bachelor of Laws degree from an Aotearoa | New Zealand university; or
 - ii. qualified for any other degree from an Aotearoa | New Zealand University with three years of work experience in a cognate field; or
 - iii. been admitted with Academic Equivalent Standing; and
- (b) be approved as a student by the Amo Matua Ture | Executive Dean Law or delegate.

There are no majors, minors or endorsements for this qualification.

The time limit for this qualification is 48 months.

This qualification adheres to the Credit Recognition and Transfer Regulations for the University.

This qualification adheres to the General Regulations for the University with no additional stipulations.

Honours, Distinction and Merit are not awarded for this qualification.
