4. Admission to the qualification

Average or better in at least 90 points of 300-level courses; or

- iii. been admitted with Academic Equivalent Standing; and

- (b) For the purposes of regulations 5(a)(i) and 5(b) of the Admission ~~R~~egulations for the University, applicants who are required to demonstrate competency in English must provide evidence of:
 - i. IELTS (Academic) 7, with no individual score below 6.5; or
 - ii. ~~TE~~ IB – total minimum 100, with minimum writing score of 23; or
 - iii. Pearson Test of English (Academic) – overall score 64 and no band below 58.
