- ( ) Successful completion of the English for Tertiary Studies (ETS) placement test with a score of 7.0 or higher.





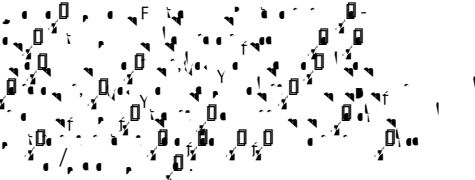

# Certificate in University Preparation (CUP)

## 1. Purpose of the Certificate

The Certificate in University Preparation (CUP) is designed to provide students who have not completed Year 12 of school with the opportunity to prepare for university study. It is a two-year program that covers the same subjects as the Year 12 and 13 school curriculum. Successful completion of the CUP allows students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

## 2. Certificate Programme

The CUP programme consists of two years of study. In the first year, students take four courses: English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Sciences. In the second year, students take three courses: English, Mathematics, and a choice of Science or Social Sciences. The program is designed to be equivalent to the Year 12 and 13 school curriculum.

## 3. Admission Requirements

Students applying for admission to the CUP must have completed Year 11 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects. They must also have a minimum overall average of 65% in their Year 11 courses. Students who have completed Year 12 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission.

Students who have completed Year 12 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission. Students who have completed Year 13 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission.

Students who have completed Year 13 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission. Students who have completed Year 14 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission.

Students who have completed Year 14 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission. Students who have completed Year 15 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission.

Students who have completed Year 15 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission. Students who have completed Year 16 of school with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% may also be considered for admission.

Note: Year 12 applicants who have been out of school for less than one school term, including those who have left school at the end of the previous year, may be considered, normally subject to the support of their former school principal. Year 13 applicants who apply during the course of their Year 13 year may also be considered, normally subject to the support of their former school principal.

## 4. Requirements for Credit

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of C in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 65% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of B in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 75% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of A in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 85% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of A- in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 80% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of B+ in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 70% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.

Students who complete the CUP with a minimum grade of C+ in all subjects and a minimum overall average of 60% will receive credit for the equivalent Year 12 and 13 school courses. This credit will allow students to enter Year 1 of a Bachelor's degree program at the University of Toronto.
